## Denominational Connections (DC) Committee Annual Report June 12th, 2009 - June 10, 2010

On Sunday, November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2010 UUNashua ordained Bruce Carey Taylor. John Sanders gave the Northern New England District (NNED) Greeting.

On January 24th, 2010, UUNashua President, Laurie Goodman, reported from the UUNashua pulpit the positive experience that she, Chris Parker and Steve Edington had at an RPM (RE Directors, Presidents & Ministers) meeting held in Concord, NH the day before.

The DC committee provided two articles to the UUNashua newsletter for February and April. One of those articles discussed the NNED Chalice Lighter (CL) program. DC will explore putting the CL application on the UUNashua website next year.

The DC recommendation discussed above is the first step toward becoming a delegate at the NNED meeting and with the UUA GA. The individual and UUNashua bilaterally must complete the process for a person to become a delegate.

By the end of June, and in his role as President of the NNED, John Sanders will have attended three (3) district meetings, all in Concord, NH.

The four New England District Boards are scheduled to meet at UUNashua June 4-5. Scheduled to attend, besides the District Boards, are UUA President Rev. Peter Morales, UUA Moderator Gini Courter, and UUA Vice President Harlan Limpert.

After the UUA GA, John Sanders will begin serving as President of the District Presidents Association, a group consisting of the Presidents of all 19 UUA Districts.
