Year In Review:

Many projects--- too many to list individually, kept the property Committee busy throughout the 2009-2010 fiscal year. Last summer's agenda included replacing the top half of the West side of the Sanctuary's slate roof, re-roofing the glass link between the Sanctuary and the RE/White Wing building, painting the most weathered of the exterior surfaces, & carpet steam cleaning. Last fall we held another successful fall clean-up with help from many fantastic volunteers. This winter saw the installation of the handrails at the front of the Sanctuary.

Looking Ahead:

In this coming year, the Property Committee is working to increase the safety of the Property and those who use it by working to achieve fire communication interconnectivity throughout the buildings. This is an ambitious project that is much too overwhelming to accomplish within a year or two. This project has a long range goal, that we will work toward in small pieces so as to not burden the Property Committee financially.

This summer there will be the "traditional" summer maintenance activities; painting, carpet steam cleaning, exterior window cleaning. Also, the 50 year old sprinkler heads in the RE/White Wing building will be replaced.

In September, we will be planting a Peace Pole. The Peace Pole was donated by Shirley Rayburn and will be a wonderful addition to the church grounds.

As always, the Property Committee has many more projects on the perpetual "To-Do" List, but budget constraints dictate how much we can accomplish in each year. So, our most important task this year is assigning priority to the many projects that we would like to complete, and spending our budget wisely.
