We have also continued our ongoing work of greeting visitors, staffing our Information/Newcomers Table each Sunday during Coffee Hour, adding photos to our electronic pictorial directory, and sending visitor postcards. In the fall we will debut our new folders for the visitor information packet.

This year we revived efforts to recognize birthdays of church members. Hand written birthday cards are sent to each UU Nashua member who has listed their birthday as part of their personal information (used only in our database, never shared with any outside lists/sources).

During this year's Youth Service we happily welcomed 4Youth to our congregation as new members. We hope this trend continues in years to come.

A Trivia night (September), Thanksgiving Dinner (November), an afternoon of holiday caroling in the neighborhood around the church (December), Soup & Bread to warm the soul (February), a Spring Egg Hunt (April), an Intergenerational Book Club (April & May) and monthly game nights provided ways for church members & friends to informally come together, have fun, and get to know more about each other.
